

	<p><b>WARSAW CITY TOUR</b> Daily at 09:40 Duration: 3.5 hours</p> <p>Visit the Old Town, a UNESCO World Heritage Site with Royal Castle, St. John's Cathedral Market Square, Barbican, colourful burger houses. Continue to the New Town with monument of Warsaw Uprising 1944 former Jewish Ghetto area with Memorial to the Heroes of the Ghetto Uprising, Umschlag Platz and Anielewicz bunker. Continue with more of the important sights of Warsaw: The Royal Route with superb aristocratic residences, churches and famous monuments, including the Holy Cross Church with urn containing the heart of Frederic Chopin, Presidential Palace, statue of Copernicus and Warsaw University. Enjoy the outdoors in Warsaw as well at The Royal Park- Łazienki – the most beautiful one in Warsaw commonly know as Łazienki or 'The Baths' with its 'Palace on the Water', the lavish summer residence of the last King of Poland, Stanislaw August Poniatowski. Other important places of interest that will be visited are the National Opera Building, Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, Monument to the Victims of Katyn.</p> <p>€ 36.00</p>
	<p><b>IN THE FOOTSTEPS OF FREDERIC CHOPIN</b> Duration 4 hours</p> <p>Frederic Chopin – Poland's greater composer and pianist lived in Warsaw for the first 20 years of his life. He was raised, educated here and his talent has developed in Warsaw's concert halls. We will visit multiple sites in the city connected to Chopin: Chopin's Museum with outstanding collection of memorabilia, Holy Cross Church where his heart rests, Chopin Family Parlor on Royal Route, Warsaw University area, where in one of the buildings Chopin family lived, Church of Visitation and Protestant Church where young Frederic used to play organs, Presidential Palace (outside) that witnessed few of Chopin's private concerts for Polish aristocrats, world famous Chopin monument in Royal Łazienki Park, Powązki Cemetery to see Chopin parents' grave.</p> <p>Dates and price on request</p>
	<p><b>JEWISH HERITAGE TOUR</b> Duration 4 hours</p> <p>Until the World War II about third part of Warsaw population was Jewish. Holocaust during Nazi occupation brought the dramatic end to Jewish culture in Warsaw.
