Warsaw began its life in the 14th century as a stronghold of the Mazovian dukes and became Poland's capital city in the 16th century. During WW II over half of the city's population and 85% of its buildings were destroyed. Immediately after the war the gigantic task of restoration began and Warsaw re-emerged like a phoenix from the ashes. The Old Town which has been completely flattened has been meticulously rebuilt, a unique effort by the citizen demonstration their will, determination and proud of their city and country.

KRAKOW INTERLUDE 2019



Long heralded as 'The New Prague', Krakow is now well established as a major tourist destination. At the height of summer, Poland's fourth largest city throngs with tour groups, all manner of tourist tack and countless pavement cafés that seem to occupy every cobble of the main square. This magical city, situated in the southeast of the country, between the Jura uplands and the Tatra Mountains, on the banks of the Wisla (Vistula) River, has one of the best-preserved medieval city centres in Europe. Dozens of churches cover almost every architectural period and are surrounded by monasteries and abbeys – walking through the Old Town streets is like drifting back through the musty pages of a historical novel. The city has largely

been left intact since the Tartar raids of the 13th century, which accounts for the largely unspoilt Krakow Old Town – now a UNESCO World Heritage Site. One of the many interesting things to see there is the old university where the astronomer Kopernikus studied in the 15th century.
